Blagovest Sendov is ambassador of Bulgaria to Japan and the Philippines. He was Rector of Sofia University and President of the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences. He was Speaker of the Bulgarian Parliament. His former international posts include President of the International Association of Universities, Extraordinary Vice-President of ICSU and President of IFIP.



Cene Bavce is professor of Management and Information Technology at the University of Promorska, Slovenia. He served in various senior positions in the Slovenian Government, including State Secretary (Minister) for Technology. He was previously with IBM and managed the IBM university relations in Central Europe, Asia and the Middle East.



Dudley Dolan is a retired Senior Lecturer from Trinity College Dublin. He has been a Vice-President of CEPIS and a Trustee of IFIP. Giorgio Ausiello is professor of Computer Engineering at the University of Roma “La Sapienza”, Editor-in-Chief of the Journal on Theoretical Computer Science – Algorithms, Automata, Complexity and Games, and President of the European Association of Theoretical Science. He is member of the Academia Europea and Past Chairman of IFIP’s TC1 on Foundations of Computer Science.



Irena Lasiecka is Professor at the University of Virginia, Charlottesville, VA since 1987. She is currently on the International Advisory Board of the Polish Academy of Sciences.



John Vincent Atanasoff II is son of John Vincent Atanasoff (JVA), named the inventor of the first automatic electronic digital computer. John Atanasoff II managed companies involved in designing computer-controlled equipment, computer graphics and software for medical device applications, including Oxberry, which designed the equipment for Terminator II. He is currently CEO of MedEfficiency Inc. and is spearheading an initiative in memory of JVA, in cooperation with the Office of the President of Bulgaria and IEEE CS.



Marc Bogdanowicz is Action Leader of the Techno-Economic Development of European Information Societies project at the ICT Unit of the Institute for Prospective Technological Studies (European Commission, Directorate-General JRC) in Seville, Spain.
