What *is* new:


- software patents






MAIN OBJECTIVES:

MAIN ACTION ITEMS:

- 1. Do Not Track option in browsers
- 2. Improved privacy protection in mobile services
- 3. Consumer access to information held by a data broker
- 4. Promoting enforceable self-regulatory codes
